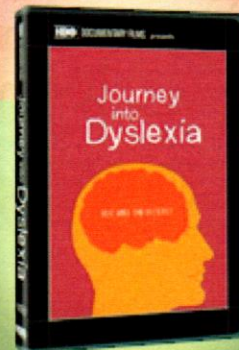


DYSLEXIA

View the HBO2 documentary film
"Journey into Dyslexia"



Delve into the world of dyslexia through the HBO2 documentary film, "Journey into Dyslexia". The award-winning film presents profiles of dyslexic students and adults who share their experiences of struggling in school and ultimately succeeding in life. Academy-Award winning filmmakers Alan and Susan Raymond examine the complexities of this differently structured brain and debunk the myths and misperceptions about dyslexia.

The film will be shown on Thursday, April 12 at 7pm in the Nashua Community College Gregg Hall in conjunction with the college's Lecture Series. A panel discussion follows the viewing and includes Dr. Melissa Farrall, a private practitioner who provides intellectual and academic assessments at MindMatters, Inc. in Amherst, NH and who is a co-founder and director of The Reading Foundation; Kathy McGhee, a dedicated parent of a child with a learning disability, and who has over 30 years of professional special education experience; and Michael Patten, a special education teacher and reading specialist with the New Hampshire Department of Education, who is currently employed at Strong Foundations Charter School in Pembroke, New Hampshire.
